18. Book of Common Prayer, 1811 edition printed between 1813 and 1820. Reign of George III (1760-1820). **2908**
19. Book of Common Prayer, 1852, luxury edition with metal clasp. Reign of Victoria (1837-1901). **2909**
20. Book of Common Prayer, miniature edition, reign of Victoria (1837-1901). **2910**
- 21. Bulla (seal) of Pope Pius VII (1800-23). 2585**
22. Book of Common Prayer, a small volume, reign of Edward VII (1901-10). **2911**

Missal = the book containing instructions for celebrating Mass, which was the ceremony that included the Lord's Supper. The word 'Missal' derives from 'Missa' which is the Latin word for Mass. It means 'to send away', i.e. dismiss, and probably referred to not allowing unbaptized people partaking of the Lord's Supper.

Breviary = the book that contained instructions for celebrating religious ceremonies at certain set times during the day. It contained hymns, prayers, etc.

Book of Hours = a book of personal devotion, like a breviary for the laity. Often elaborately decorated and with miniature pictures.
